


Employers' Guide to Childcare in Windham and Southern Windsor Counties

The following document includes information and resources for Windham and Southern Windsor County Area employers, specific to resources on accessing and affording child care.



Types of Childcare

- **Registered/Licensed Family Childcare Homes** - Care is provided in a private home for children of varying ages, ranging from infants to school-age. These locations have a max capacity of 10-12 children.
- **Licensed Centers** - Larger locations that provide care for more than 10 children and often include multiple classrooms. Children are usually grouped by age, including infant, toddler, and preschool programs. Centers are required to meet specific health, safety, and staff training requirements.

- **After-school care** - Supervised care for school-aged children during non-school hours.
- **Summer Care/Camps** - These programs vary and can be offered by additional organizations, such as school districts, parks and recreation departments, and community-based organizations. These programs do not operate on a regular or continuous basis.

How to Find Childcare

Step 1: Gather Important Information:

- How old are the children who need care?
- What is the geographic area care will be needed? What town/area? (near home or work?)
- What hours are needed?
- Does the quality of the potential program matter?
- What type of program is preferred? (i.e. home-based provider or center-based care)

Step 2: Explore Potential Care Options:

- **Option 1: Independent Online Search** - In Vermont, the **Bright Futures Child Care Information System** is a state-organized search engine for all registered and licensed child care providers in the state. Providers can be searched by location, program type, child's age, and star (quality) rating. www.brightfutures.dcf.state.vt.us

Step 3: Parents/Guardians directly contact Childcare Providers to select best option:

- Most providers will have waitlists families can join if slots are not currently available.
- Slot availability will be based on the child's age and size of the provider.

Paying for Child Care in the Region

State of VT Child Care Financial Assistance Program

The **State of VT Child Care Financial Assistance Program (CCFAP)** helps families pay for registered and/or licensed care based on income. In 2024 major updates were made to the income eligibility requirements for the program.

For instance, as of March 2025, a family of 4 earning between \$128,000 and \$136,000 will pay only \$275 a week for both kids to attend full-time childcare!

Who is Eligible:

- Residents of Vermont
- Children up to 13 years of age
- Currently employed, seeking employment, or attending school
- Meet Income Guidelines (see below for link)
- Have less than \$1 million in assets.

How to apply:

- Visit the website (linked below) to print and mail an application to the SAPCC or Winston Prouty
- Visit the website and apply online via the **Parent Portal**

Employer Strategies for Supporting Staff

Expanded Employer-Provided Childcare Tax Credit

In 2026, the federal employer-provided childcare tax credit will be expanding significantly. This credit allows employers to receive a tax credit for providing childcare on site or contracting with a third party to provide childcare for their employees. The expanded benefits include:

- Allowing a refund of up to 50% of qualified expenses, increased from 25%
- Allowing small businesses to pool their resources
- Increasing the maximum credit from \$150,000 to \$600,000
